Transport plays an essential role in all




The London Lorry Control Scheme

- Not a Lorry Ban
- Not designed to prevent deliveries/collections at any time – just control the routes that are used
- Helps manage noise nuisance within the M25
- In operation for 30 years

Restrictions and Network

- Excluded Route Network (ERN) travel at any time without permission
- Restricted Roads Vehicles over 18 tonnes need permission to use restricted roads during the hours of control:
 - Monday Friday: 9pm 7am (including 9pm Friday night to 7am Saturday morning)
 - Saturday: 1pm 7am Monday morning
- Must adhere to rules of the scheme



Administration and Enforcement

- London Councils manage the scheme for Boroughs
- Contracted enforcement officers record observations
- In-house Administration Team

 - Enquiries and free routing advice
 - Enforcement processing enquiries, PCNs, appeals
