1. City Read: Presentation by Andy Ryan, Stellar Libraries:

Andy Ryan gave a very interesting presentation. Almost every London borough has now signed up to the "City Read" which is a campaign and series of events that aim to bring the capital together over one book and promote libraries. Each participating borough receives 20 free books and access to buy an unlimited amount of copies for an additional £1 each. The launch event is 2 April 2012 at the British Library.

2. Film APP: Presentation "Creating an Income from Filming" by Andrew Pavord, Film Fixer – LB Southwark

Andrew gave a useful insight into the work of Film App and the benefits it can bring to boroughs, and in particular how it has the potential to help boroughs raise income and boost the local economy e.g. Lewisham has recently received £30K for one days filming and Southwark makes £400K per year. Each full scale film production is worth the equivalent of £2m to the local economy. London needs to work hard to attract these major film companies as there is evidence of it loosing out to other cities that are eager for the business.

Film App is the first port of call for a film company, it collects data and PI's and notifies the police and residents in the local area. It also manages online payments in advance. Film App provides a coordinate approach to film location management across London which is helping London to retain business. 11 boroughs are actively using the system and 5 more are preparing to sign up and a further 6 have expressed an interest.
