- Set up a creative learning space in the library where the activity takes place.
- Prepare and organise study and reference resources for the children participating.



- Welcome children as they arrive making sure that children feel at ease.
- Show children how to find out appropriate book resources within the library to complete their homework
- Support children to access relevant online resources by using the library's public computers.
- Help to clear the space when the club finishes.

Anything else you should know?

- You will need to have a satisfactory Criminal Records Bureau check carried out. This is something we will arrange for you.
- You will need to provide the contact details of two referees who are over 18, know you well but are not a member of your family.

Where and when you would be volunteering

- You will volunteer at a Redbridge Library running a homework help club and offering this volunteering opportunity. Please ask staff for details of the programme running in your chosen branch.
- These clubs run weekly, term time only, for one or two hours. You will be expected to arrive 30 minutes before a session starts to help set up and stay for 30 minutes after the session ends to help clear up.
- All volunteers are placed initially on a one-month trial basis. Volunteers and activities are reviewed every six months.
