








1. British voting intention – July 2005-October 2017




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
1. London vote share 1955-2017 – General Elections



1. Difference between London vote share and GB vote share, 1955-2017* – General Elections




1. London vote share 1968-2014 – Borough Elections


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1. London Voting Intention – October 2017




1. Cllr numbers per borough – updated November 2017







3. Our broad assumptions

- Labour vote share and membership has been expanding
- Conservatives facing a London identity crisis
- Liberal Democrats battered but soldiering on
- Greens in danger of being squeezed
- UKIP fast evaporating
- Independent candidates an elusive but definite danger

3. Our approach – methodology

To examine the plausibility of borough control changing in three key case studies, we have applied the following "vulnerability test"

We have:


- Used 2014 local election data and results as our baseline.
- Calculated minimum swing* needed for (a) one and (b) all seats in key 'marginal' wards to switch party.**
- Calculated critical swing needed across borough, for challenger to take control of council.
- Used swing towards challenger seen during 2017 GE as a benchmark of plausibility.


*Swing is defined as the relative shift in vote share between two parties

3a. A Conservative borough which might go Labour?

3a. Wandsworth – vote share 2006-2017

If Labour voter base turns out anywhere near as it did at 2017 general election, then possible Wandsworth might change from Conservative to Labour control






3b. A Liberal Democrat fight back?




3b. Kingston - vote share 2006-17

If the Lib Dems can repeat 2010 performance, buoyed by the 2017 general election results, then they could take back the council

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

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
3c. A Labour borough which might go Conservative?

3c. Harrow – vote share 2006-2017

If narrowing between Labour and Conservative vote share continues locally, and Labour vote share is similar to 2017 general election, Labour likely to hold borough



*General Election result for Harrow West and Harrow East only, result does not include the three wards which are based in Ruislip, Northwood & Pinner – Hatch End, Pinner and Pinner South wards



Swing from LAB to CON in Constituency in 2017 GE Swing needed for CON to take ALL SEATS in 2018 LE Swing needed for CON to take ONE SEAT in 2018 LE

3d. What impact might Momentum have in 2018?


3d. What impact is Momentum having?

- There is a bigger Momentum presence in some boroughs than others
- Quite a few boroughs are seeing local CLP challenges
- We can envisage one or two boroughs' Labour slate in May 2018 being significantly different to that of 2014
- However, it is possible (if perhaps unlikely) that Momentum supporters will control a borough Cabinet.

4. Summing up

- Local elections also taking in other major cities so....
- Major test for Conservatives and Theresa May (in London and nationally)
 - One of the Big Three Conservative boroughs in Central London could change hands
- Labour will be disappointed if they don't win any more boroughs
- Lib Dems will be pleased to hold Sutton and delighted if they win another borough
- Turnout could be over 40% (?)
- Will be fascinating to see how many boroughs raise Council Tax pre-election
- But path of national politics can yet radically change, affecting election results
- ...expect the unexpected!
