Priorities agreed for the group (two-year work programme anticipated):

Leadership and management

To include effective Local Area governance, partnership with health, strategic planning, parental engagement, workforce development

Inclusion in mainstream

To include minimum local offer, working with academies, pathways, pupils on SEN Support, exclusions, incentivising inclusion and working with parents

SLCD and SEMH

To include assessment, managing demand, provision mapping, 'quality first' provision, 'what works', possible London advisory document

Preparation for adulthood

To include guidance on post-16 offer, employment pathways, preparation for independence, capturing young person's voice, MIME data for planning, up-skilling LAs on post-16 funding

Funding

To include strategies for managing DSG and GF; joint commissioning

Activities to support priorities

- Sharing best practice learning visits, case studies, learning event, draw on research / evaluation
- Develop advisory documents for partners / parents / schools on reasonable expectations of local offer / support and pathways
- Peer challenge / review
- Use SEND managers strategic network to support development work
- Map existing arrangements (strategic partnerships)
- Effectiveness questions including strategic planning for medium / long-term
- Core data-sets for benchmarking
- Finance: need London collate responses to call for evidence
- Identify best practice in working with parent s and capturing the voice of children

Areas for further consideration

- Need to join up with other priorities: often talking about 'the same children'
- Map groups and working parties already in existence working on SEND agenda
- Need to focus peer review to manageable
- Learning from outside London from other RIAs across the country from their SLI activity

Next Steps for the Group

- Link with SEND Managers Strategic Network to avoid duplication (Actions: Ben to contact Joan Lightfoot)
- Templates for more detailed self-evaluation to support each theme and include description of the objective: what will be better? (Action: Ben to develop templates and circulate for completion by identified groups* - see below)
- Template for learning visits (Action: Ben to develop)
- Further meeting in June/July to confirm activities and data sets (Action Ben / John)
- Learning visits all agreed to host a visit to share good practice (Action to follow next group meeting unless members action sooner; each LA to identify one or two areas which they would be willing to share)
- Develop advisory documents or guidance/ the London SEND offer (Action: timescale for these to be discussed at next meeting)
- Peer review(s) in the autumn (Action: discuss at next meeting and agree a borough to be the first for a Peer Review and the team to be reviewers)
- Data requirement / core SEND data-set for next agenda (Action: Ben, Rashid)

The overall aim agreed by the group was not only to improve practice in individual boroughs but by working collectively, to achieve whole system improvement.
