- Our new surface water group will ensure we're better prepared for any flooding events. It includes the GLA, Environment Agency, TfL, London Boroughs, and Thames Water.
- Together, we'll take forward the London Flood Review actions, talk to communities and create London's first citywide surface water flooding strategy.
- By working together, we'll improve London's emergency response and communications during flood events. This will help to protect Londoners and reduce the impacts of flooding.
- It's not just about reacting to flooding it's about taking steps now to protect our city.

That's why we're working with our partners and government to get funding for more schemes to reduce the impact of flash floods, especially nature-based schemes and more tree planting. Both can help to reduce the risks.

- We're protecting the next generation too. Our climateresilient schools programme is also reducing disruption to education from other extreme weather events, such as heatwaves.
- Finally, we've created a map of sustainable drainage schemes across London.
