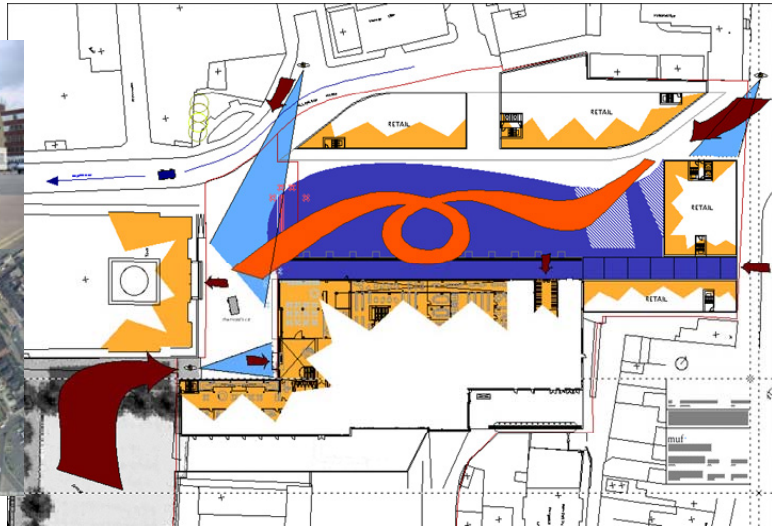

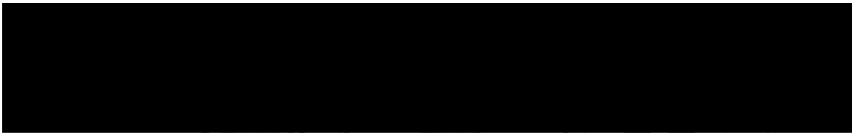

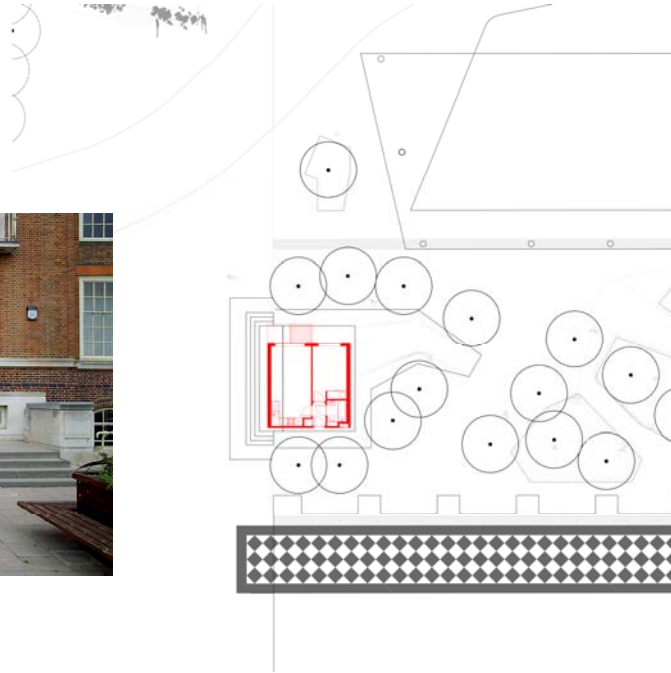










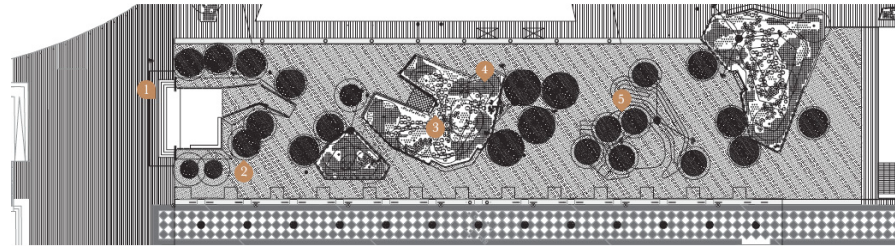




1) The steps to the town hall are mirrored and reconstructed as the threshold to the arboretum.
