Achieving Excellence in CEIAG 2010/2011

Aim

The vision is for London Authorities, working with public, private and third sector partners to put in place 'models of excellence' that demonstrate a universal and seamless offer of career education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG) for all young people wherever they access it, with coherent and targeted support for those most in need. This contributes towards the new 14-19 entitlement for all young people outlined in the Government's report on 14-19 Reform: next steps (DCSF, 2008).¹

Themes for 2010/11

1. Quality

To agree London quality standards/ models of excellence for CEIAG services in pre and post 16 provisions in the context of 'Statutory Guidance: Impartial Careers Education'.

2. 14-19 Curriculum & Progression

3. Workforce

To include wider Integrated Youth Support Services, holistic advisers and other specialists.

4. Narrowing Achievement Gap

Specifically work around Looked after Children

There will be 3 strands which run through each of the themes above:

- Sharing of best practice/ lessons learnt
- ❖ Young people involvement, in particular in the design and development
- Parental involvement
